Establishment of New Surface Water Treatment Plant and Extension of Existing Surface Water Treatment Plant through Design, Build and Operate Contract

The Water & Sanitation Agency Faisalabad, Pakistan has received funds from Agence Française de Développement ("AFD") and the Government of Punjab, Pakistan toward the cost of the Extension of Water Resources for Faisalabad City, Phase II and intends to apply part of the funds to payments under the contract for the Works to be executed under Design, Build and Operate Contract for which this invitation is issued. The Employer intends to initially select a maximum of 5 firms for development of new water production resources through establishment of new Water Treatment Plant, extension of existing Water Treatment Plant and reduction in non-revenue water & improvement in services delivery through Design, Build and Operate mode.

Specific components of the Works will include:

New Water Treatment Plant shall be 25 MGD (113,652 m³/day) which include components such as:

- Intake structure on Canal
- Pre-settling facility and pumping station
- Raw water storage
- Water treatment plant

5 MGD (22,730  $\rm m^3/day$ ) extension to the existing 10 MGD Water Treatment Plant which include following components:

- Additional trains providing conventional treatment
- Pre-settling tanks
- · Additional sludge drying beds
- Equipment necessary to be installed in the existing facilities to accommodate the extension

Non-Revenue Water (NRW) reduction program include components;

- Establishment of one pilot zone with connections ranging from 6,000 to 9,000
- Installation of bulk meters and customer meters
- Installation of SCADA system
- Leak detection and piloting the concept of 24/7 service

It is expected that invitations for bid will be made in July,2023.

### **PART 1 – Initial Selection Procedures**

### **Section I - Instructions to Applicants (ITA)**

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#### A. General

## 1. Scope of Application

In connection with the invitation for Initial Selection indicated in Section II, Initial Selection Data Sheet (ISDS), the Employer, as defined in the ISDS, issues these Initial Selection Documents ("Initial Selection Documents") to prospective applicants ("Applicants") interested in submitting applications ("Applications") for Initial Selection for the Works (Design, Build and Operate) described in Section VII, Scope of Employer's Requirement.

#### 2. Source of Funds

2.1 The Employer **specified in the ISDS** has received or has applied for financing (hereinafter called "funds") from *Agence Française de Développement* (hereinafter called "**AFD**") toward the project named **in the ISDS**. The Employer intends to apply a portion of the funds to eligible payments under the contract(s) for which these Initial Selection Documents are issued.

# 3. Corrupt and Fraudulent Practices

- 3.1 AFD requires compliance with its policy regarding corrupt and fraudulent practices as set forth in Section VI AFD Policy Corrupt and Fraudulent Practices Environmental and Social Responsibility.
- 3.2 In further pursuance of this policy, Applicants shall permit and shall cause their subcontractors and subconsultants, to permit AFD to inspect all accounts, records and other documents relating to the submission of the Application, Bid submission (in case of Initial Selection), and contract performance (in the case of award), and to have them audited by auditors appointed by AFD.

## 4. Eligible Applicants

4.1 An Applicant may be a firm that is a private entity, a stateowned enterprise or institution subject to ITA 4.3 - or any combination of such entities in the form of a joint venture (JV) under an existing agreement or with the intent to enter into such an agreement supported by a letter of intent. In the case of a joint venture, all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the entire Contract in accordance with the Contract terms. The JV shall nominate an authorized representative who shall have the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the JV during the Initial Selection process, Bidding (in the event the JV submits Bid) and during contract execution (in the event the JV is awarded the Contract). Unless specified in the ISDS, there is no limit on the number of members in a JV.

- 4.2 A firm may apply for initial selection both individually, and as part of a joint venture, or as a subcontractor. If initially selected, it will not be permitted to bid for the same contract both as an individual firm and as a part of the joint venture. However, a firm may participate as a subcontractor in more than one Application, but only in that capacity. Applications submitted in violation of this procedure will be rejected.
- 4.3 AFD's eligibility criteria for initial selection are described in Section V, Eligibility Criteria.
- 4.4 Applicants shall not have a conflict of interest. Any Applicant found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. An Applicant may be considered to have a conflict of interest for the purpose of this initial selection process, if the Applicant:
  - a) Directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by or is under common control with another Applicant; or
  - b) Receives or has received any direct or indirect subsidy from another Applicant; or
  - c) Has the same legal representative as another Applicant; or
  - d) Has a relationship with another Applicant, directly or through common third parties, that puts it in a position to influence the application of another Applicant, or influence the decisions of the Employer regarding this initial selection process; or
  - e) Any of its affiliates participated as a consultant in the preparation of the design or technical specifications of the Works that are the subject of the initial selection; or
  - f) Any of its affiliates has been hired (or is proposed to be hired) by the Employer as Employer's Representative for the Contract implementation; or
  - g) Has a close business or family relationship with a professional staff of the Employer (or of the project implementing agency, or of a recipient of a part of the Funds who: (i) are directly or indirectly involved in the preparation of Initial Selection Documents or specifications of the contract, and/or the initial selection evaluation process; or (ii) would be involved in the implementation or supervision of such contract unless the conflict stemming from such relationship has been resolved in a manner acceptable to AFD throughout the procurement process and execution of the contract.
- 4.5 An Applicant shall not be under suspension from submitting an Application by the Employer as the result of the execution of a Bid-Securing Declaration.
- 4.6 An Applicant shall provide such evidence of eligibility satisfactory to the Employer, as the Employer shall reasonably request.

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### 5. Eligible Materials, Equipment and Services

The materials, equipment and services to be supplied under the Contract and financed by AFD may have their origin in any country subject to the restrictions specified in Section V, Eligibility Criteria, and all expenditures under the Contract will not contravene such restrictions.

#### B. Contents of the Initial Selection Documents

# 6. Sections of Initial Selection Documents

6.1 The Initial Selection Documents consist of parts 1 and 2 which comprise all the sections indicated below, and which should be read in conjunction with any Addendum issued in accordance with ITA 8.

#### **PART 2: Employer's Requirements**

- Section VII Scope of Employer's Requirements
- 6.2 Unless obtained directly from the Employer, the Employer accepts no responsibility for the completeness of the Initial Selection Documents, responses to requests for clarification, or Addenda in accordance with ITA 8. In case of any discrepancies, documents issued directly by the Employer shall prevail.
- 6.3 The Applicant is expected to examine all instructions, forms, and terms in the Initial Selection Documents and to furnish with its Application all information or documentation as is required by the Initial Selection Documents.

# 7. Clarification of Initial Selection Documents

7.1 A prospective Applicant requiring any clarification of the Initial Selection Documents shall contact the Employer in writing at the Employer's address indicated in the ISDS. The Employer will respond in writing to any request for clarification provided that such request is received no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the deadline for submission of the applications. The Employer shall forward a copy of its response to all prospective Applicants who have obtained the Initial Selection Documents directly from the Employer, including a description of the inquiry but without identifying its source. If so indicated in the ISDS, the Employer shall also promptly publish its response at the web page identified in the ISDS. Should the Employer deem it necessary to amend the Initial Selection Documents as a result of a clarification, it shall do so

following the procedure under ITA 8 and in accordance with the provisions of ITA 17.2.

# 8. Amendment of Initial Selection Documents

- 8.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of Applications, the Employer may amend the Initial Selection Documents by issuing an Addendum.
- 8.2 Any Addendum issued shall be part of the Initial Selection Documents and shall be communicated in writing to all Applicants who have obtained the Initial Selection Documents from the Employer. The Employer shall promptly publish the Addendum at the Employer's web page identified in the ISDS.
- 8.3 To give Applicants reasonable time to take an Addendum into account in preparing their Applications, the Employer may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of Applications in accordance with ITA 17.2.

### C. Preparation of Applications

## 9. Cost of Application

9.1 The Applicant shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Application. The Employer will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the Initial Selection process.

### 10. Language of Application

10.1 The Application as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Initial Selection exchanged by the Applicant and the Employer, shall be written in the language specified **in the ISDS**. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the Application may be in another language, provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in the language specified **in the ISDS**, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Application, the translation shall govern.

# 11. Documents Comprising the Application

- 11.1 The Application shall comprise the following:
  - a) **Application Submission Form**, in accordance with ITA 12;
  - b) **Eligibility**: documentary evidence establishing the Applicant's eligibility, in accordance with ITA 13;
  - Qualifications: documentary evidence establishing the Applicant's qualifications, in accordance with ITA 14; and
  - d) any other document required as specified in the ISDS.
- 11.2 The Applicant shall furnish information on commissions and gratuities, if any, paid or to be paid to agents or any other party relating to this Application.

### 12. Application Submission Form

12.1 The Applicant shall complete an Application Submission Form as provided in Section IV, Application Forms. This

Form must be completed without any alteration to its format.

- 13. Documents
  Establishing the
  Eligibility of the
  Applicant
- 13.1 To establish its eligibility in accordance with ITA 4, the Applicant shall complete and sign the Statement of Integrity, Eligibility and Social and Environmental Responsibility as provided in Section IV, Application Forms, without any alteration to its format and furnish supporting documentation as specified in Forms ELI-1.1 and ELI-1.2.
- 14. Documents
  Establishing the
  Qualifications of
  the Applicant
- 14.1 To establish its qualifications to perform the contract(s) in accordance with Section III, Initial Selection Criteria, the Applicant shall provide the information requested in the corresponding Forms included in Section IV, Application Forms.
- 14.2 Wherever an Application Form requires an Applicant to state a monetary amount, Applicants should indicate the USD equivalent using the rate of exchange determined as follows:
  - a) for turnover or financial data required for each year exchange rate prevailing on the last day of the respective calendar year (in which the amounts for that year are to be converted); and
  - value of single contract exchange rate prevailing on the date of the contract.

Exchange rates shall be taken from the publicly available rate published by the Central Bank of the Employer's country; unless otherwise stated **in the ISDS**. Any error in determining the exchange rates in the Application may be corrected by the Employer.

- 15. Signing of the Application and Number of Copies
- 15.1 The Applicant shall prepare one original of the documents comprising the Application as described in ITA 11 and clearly mark it "ORIGINAL". The original of the Application shall be typed or written in indelible ink and shall be signed by a person duly authorized to sign on behalf of the Applicant. In case the Applicant is a JV, the Application shall be signed by an authorized representative of the JV on behalf of the JV and so as to be legally binding on all the members as evidenced by a power of attorney signed by their legally authorized signatories. If a JV has not been formalized and a letter of intent to form a JV is presented, then the Letter of Intent shall be signed by every member of the intended JV.
- 15.2 The Applicant shall submit copies of the signed original Application, in the number specified **in the ISDS**, and clearly mark them "COPY". In the event of any discrepancy between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail.

### D. Submission of Applications

### 16. Sealing and Marking of Applications

- 16.1 The Applicant shall enclose the original and the copies of the Application in a sealed envelope that shall:
  - a) Bear the name and address of the Applicant;
  - b) Be addressed to the Employer in accordance with ITA 17.1; and
  - c) bear the specific identification of this Initial Selection process
- 16.2 The Employer will accept no responsibility for not processing any envelope that was not identified as required in ITA 16.1 above.

### 17. Deadline for Submission of Applications

- 17.1 Applicants may either submit their Applications by mail or by hand. Applications shall be received by the Employer at the address and no later than the deadline indicated **in the ISDS**. When so specified **in the ISDS**, Applicants have the option of submitting their Applications electronically, in accordance with electronic Application submission procedures specified **in the ISDS**.
- 17.2 The Employer may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of Applications by amending the Initial Selection Documents in accordance with ITA 8, in which case all rights and obligations of the Employer and the Applicants subject to the previous deadline shall thereafter be subject to the deadline as extended.

### 18. Late Applications

18.1 The Employer reserves the right to accept Applications received after the deadline for Submission of Applications.

## 19. Opening of Applications

- 19.1 The Employer shall open all Applications at the date, time and place specified **in the ISDS**. Late Applications shall be treated in accordance with ITA 18.1.
- 19.2 Applications submitted electronically (if permitted pursuant to ITA 17.1) shall be opened in accordance with the procedures specified **in the ISDS**.
- 19.3 The Employer shall prepare a record of the opening of Applications to include, as a minimum, the name of the Applicants. A copy of the record shall be distributed to all Applicants.

### E. Procedures for Evaluation of Applications

### 20. Confidentiality

20.1 Information relating to the Applications, their evaluation and results of the Initial Selection shall not be disclosed to Applicants or any other persons not officially concerned with the Initial Selection process until the notification of Initial Selection results is made to all Applicants in accordance with ITA 28. 20.2 From the deadline for submission of Applications to the time of notification of the results of the Initial Selection in accordance with ITA 28, any Applicant that wishes to contact the Employer on any matter related to the Initial Selection process may do so only in writing.

### 21. Clarification of Applications

- 21.1 To assist in the evaluation of Applications, the Employer may, at its discretion, ask an Applicant for a clarification (including missing documents) of its Application, to be submitted within a stated reasonable period of time. Any request for clarification from the Employer and all clarifications from the Applicant shall be in writing.
- 21.2 If an Applicant does not provide clarifications and/or documents requested by the date and time set in the Employer's request for clarification, its Application shall be evaluated based on the information and documents available at the time of evaluation of the Application.

### 22. Responsiveness of Applications

22.1 The Employer may reject any Application which is not responsive to the requirements of the Initial Selection Documents. In case the information furnished by the Applicant is incomplete or otherwise requires clarification as per ITA 21.1, and the Applicant fails to provide satisfactory clarification and/or missing information, it may result in disqualification of the Applicant.

### 23. Margin of Preference

23.1 Margin of preference for domestic bidders shall not apply in the bidding process resulting from this initial selection.

#### 24. Subcontractors

- 24.1 Unless otherwise stated **in the ISDS**, the Employer does not intend to execute any specific elements of the Works by subcontractors selected in advance by the Employer (so-called "Nominated Subcontractors").
- 24.2 A "specialized subcontractor" is a subcontractor hired for specialized work as defined by the Employer in Section III 4.2 Experience. If no specialized work is specified by the Employer as such, subcontractors experience shall not be considered for Applications evaluation.
- 24.3 The Employer may decide to permit subcontracting for certain specialized works as indicated in Section III 4.2 Experience. When such subcontracting is permitted by the Employer, the specialized subcontractors experience shall be considered for the evaluation. Section III, Initial Selection Criteria, describes the qualification criteria for subcontractors.
- 24.4 The Applicant shall not propose to subcontract the whole of the contract.

## F. Evaluation of Applications and Initial Selection of Applicants

## 25. Evaluation of Applications

- 25.1 The Employer shall use the factors, methods, criteria, and requirements defined in Section III, Initial Selection Criteria to evaluate the qualifications of the Applicants, and no other factors, methods, criteria, or requirements shall be used. The Employer reserves the right to waive minor deviations from the qualification criteria if they do not materially affect the technical capability and financial resources of an Applicant to perform the Contract.
- 25.2 Only the qualifications of the Applicant shall be considered. In particular, the qualifications of a parent or other affiliated company that is not party to the Applicant under a JV in accordance with ITA 4.2 shall not be considered.
- 26. Employer's Right to Reject All Applications
- 26.1 The Employer reserves the right to annul the Initial Selection process and reject all Applications at any time, without thereby incurring any liability to the Applicants.
- 27. Initial Selection of Applicants
- 27.1 The range of Applicants that the Employer may Initially Select (x = maximum number) is specified **in the ISDS**.
- 27.2 Initial Selection of Applicants involves several steps, as follows:
  - a) Step 1 Table 1 Evaluation: The first step of Initial Selection involves evaluation against the methods, criteria and requirements described in Section III, Table 1: Qualification Criteria;
  - b) **Step 2 Rejection**: Applicants that do not meet any of the qualification criteria and requirements in Table 1: Qualification Criteria will not be evaluated further, and will be eliminated from the Initial Selection process;
  - c) Step 3 Long List: Applicants that meet any of the qualification criteria and requirements in Table 1: Qualification Criteria will be long listed, and evaluated further;
  - d) **Step 4**: Depending on the number of Applicants that are long listed, one of the following options will apply:
    - <u>Option 1</u>: All are Initially Selected: Where the number of long listed Applicants is  $\leq x$ , all long listed Applicants are Initially Selected. In this scenario, there is no requirement to evaluate these long listed Applicants against Table 2: Rated Criteria. Therefore, Steps 5 to 7 shall not apply;
    - Option 2: Applicants are evaluated using Table 2 Evaluation: Where the number of long listed Applicants is > x, the Employer shall evaluate all long listed Applicants against Table 2: Rated Criteria. This

- evaluation method involves scoring each Application against rated criteria using the scoring methodology described;
- e) **Step 5 Rank Applicants**: The total scores, from this step of the Initial Selection evaluation, for each long listed Applicant are compared, and the Applicants are ranked from the highest to the lowest total score;
- f) Step 6 Initial Selection up to x: In accordance with the value selected by the Employer for x, the Employer Initially Selects the Applicants that are ranked from the highest score, to the Application ranked as x:
- g) Step 7 Reject x+1 Applicants: Where the number of long listed Applicants is > x, the Employer rejects all Applicants that are ranked greater than x, i.e. ranked as x+1, x+2, x+3, etc.

### 28. Notification of Initial Selection

- 28.1 The Employer shall notify all Initially Selected Applicants in writing that they have been Initially Selected. In providing this notification the Employer shall include the names of all Applicants that have been Initially Selected.
- 28.2 The Employer shall separately notify all other Applicants that they have not been Initially Selected, and that they have been eliminated from the process. Any Applicant that has been eliminated from the process at this stage may request, in writing, the grounds on which they were eliminated.

### 29. Invitation for Bids

- 29.1 Promptly after the notification of the results of the Initial Selection, the Employer shall invite Bids from all the Applicants that have been initially selected.
- 29.2 Bidders may be required to provide a Bid Security or a Bid-Securing Declaration acceptable to the Employer in the form and an amount to be specified in the Bidding Documents, and the successful Bidder shall be required to provide a Performance Security as specified in the Bidding Documents.

### 30. Changes in Qualifications of Applicants

30.1 Any change in the structure or formation of an Applicant after being initially selected in accordance with ITA 27 and invited to bid (including, in the case of a JV, any change in the structure or formation of any member and also including any change in any specialized subcontractor) shall be subject to the written approval of the Employer prior to the deadline for submission of Bids. Such approval shall be denied if (i) ) as a consequence of the change, the Applicant no longer meets any of the qualification criteria set forth in Section III, Initial Selection Criteria, Table 1 - Qualification Criteria; or (ii) in the opinion of the Employer, the change may result in a substantial reduction in competition; or (iii) an initially selected applicant proposes to associate with a disqualified applicant or in case of a disqualified joint venture, any of its members; or (iv) no longer continues to be in the list of Initially Selected Applicants as a result of the Employer's re-evaluation of the Application in accordance with ITA 27. Any such change should be submitted to the Employer not later than fourteen (14) days after the date of the Invitation for Bids.

  procurement process or performance of an AFD-financed contract;
- 2.3 Are listed for financial sanctions by the United Nations, the European Union and/or France for the purposes of fight-against-terrorist financing or threat to international peace and security;
- 2.4 Have been subject within the past five years to a contract termination fully settled against them for significant or persistent failure to comply with their contractual obligations during contract performance, unless this termination was challenged and dispute resolution is still pending or has not confirmed a full settlement against them;
- 2.5 Have not fulfilled their fiscal obligations regarding payments of taxes in accordance with the legal provisions of either the country where they are constituted or the Contracting Authority's country;

Means any Person whether natural or legal, firm, company, corporation, government, state or state agency or any association, or group of two or more of the foregoing (whether or not having separate legal status).

- 2.6 Are subject to an exclusion decision of the World Bank and are listed on the website <a href="http://www.worldbank.org/debarr">http://www.worldbank.org/debarr</a>, unless they provide supporting information together with their Statement of Integrity (Form available as Appendix to the Application, Bid or Proposal Submission Form) which shows that this exclusion is not relevant in the context of the Contract;
- 2.7 Have created false documents or committed misrepresentation in documentation requested by the Contracting Authority as part of the procurement process of the Contract.
- 3. State-owned entities may compete only if they can establish that they (i) are legally and financially autonomous, and (ii) operate under commercial law. To be eligible, a state-owned entity shall establish to AFD's satisfaction, through all relevant documents, including its Charter and other information AFD may request, that it: (i) is a legal entity separate from their state (ii) does not currently receive substantial subsidies or budget support; (iii) operates like any commercial enterprise, and, inter alia, is not obliged to pass on its surplus to their state, can acquire rights and liabilities, borrow funds and be liable for repayment of its debts, and can be declared bankrupt.

# Section VI – AFD Policy - Corrupt and Fraudulent Practices – Environmental and Social Responsibility

### 1. Corrupt and Fraudulent Practices

The Contracting Authority and the suppliers, contractors, subcontractors, consultants or subconsultants must observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process and performance of the contract. The Contracting Authority means the Purchaser, the Employer, the Client, as the case may be, for the procurement of goods, works, plants, consulting services or non-consulting services.

By signing the Statement of Integrity the suppliers, contractors, subcontractors, consultants or subconsultants declare that (i) "it did not engage in any practice likely to influence the contract award process to the Contracting Authority's detriment, and that it did not and will not get involved in any anti-competitive practice", and that (ii) "the procurement process and the performance of the contract did not and shall not give rise to any act of corruption or fraud".

Moreover, AFD requires including in the Procurement Documents and AFD-financed contracts a provision requiring that suppliers, contractors, subcontractors, consultants or subconsultants will permit AFD to inspect their accounts and records relating to the procurement process and performance of the AFD-financed contract, and to have them audited by auditors appointed by AFD.

AFD reserves the right to take any action it deems appropriate to check that these ethics rules are observed and reserves, in particular, the rights to:

- Reject a proposal for a contract award if it is established that during the selection process the bidder or consultant that is recommended for the award has been convicted of corruption, directly or by means of an agent, or has engaged in fraud or anti-competitive practices in view of being awarded the contract;
- b) Declare misprocurement when it is established that, at any time, the Contracting Authority, the suppliers, contractors, subcontractors, consultants, subconsultants or their representatives have engaged in acts of corruption, fraud or anti-competitive practices during the procurement process or performance of the contract without the Contracting Authority having taken appropriate action in due time satisfactory to AFD to remedy the situation, including by failing to inform AFD at the time they knew of such practices.

AFD defines, for the purposes of this provision, the terms set forth below as follows:

- a) Corruption of a Public Officer means:
  - The act of promising, offering or giving to a Public Officer, directly or indirectly, an undue advantage of any kind for himself or for another Person¹ or entity, for such Public Officer to act or refrain from acting in his official capacity; or
  - The act by which a Public Officer solicits or accepts, directly or indirectly, an undue advantage of any kind for himself or for another Person or entity, for such Public Officer to act or refrain from acting in his official capacity.
- b) A Public Officer shall be construed as meaning:
  - Any person who holds a legislative, executive, administrative or judicial mandate (within the country of the Contracting Authority) regardless of whether that natural Person was nominated or elected, regardless of the permanent or temporary, paid or unpaid nature of the position and regardless of the hierarchical level the natural Person occupies;

Means any Person whether natural or legal, firm, company, corporation, government, state or state agency or any association, or group of two or more of the foregoing (whether or not having separate legal status).

- Any other natural Person who performs a public function, including for a State institution or a State-owned company, or who provides a public service;
- Any other natural Person defined as a Public Officer by the national laws of the country of the Contracting Authority.
- c) Corruption of a Private Person<sup>2</sup> means:
  - The act of promising, offering or giving to any Private Person, directly or indirectly, an
    undue advantage of any kind for himself or for another Person or entity, for such Private
    Person to perform or refrain from performing any act in breach of its legal, contractual or
    professional obligations; or;
  - The act by which any Private Person solicits or accepts, directly or indirectly, an undue advantage of any kind for himself or for another Person or entity, for such Private Person to perform or refrain from performing any act in breach of its legal, contractual or professional obligations.
- d) Fraud means any dishonest conduct (act or omission), whether or not it constitutes a criminal offence, deliberately intended to deceive others, to intentionally conceal items, to violate or vitiate consent, to circumvent legal or regulatory requirements and/or to violate internal rules in order to obtain illegitimate profit.
- e) Anti-competitive practices mean:
  - Any concerted or implied practices which have as their object or effect the prevention, restriction or distortion of competition within a marketplace, especially where they (i) limit access to the marketplace or free exercise of competition by other undertakings, (ii) prevent free, competition-driven price determination by artificially causing price increases or decreases, (iii) restrict or control production, markets, investments or technical progress; or (iv) divide up market shares or sources of supply;
  - Any abuse by one undertaking or a group of undertakings which hold a dominant position on an internal market or on a substantial part of it;
  - Any practice whereby prices are quoted or set unreasonably low, the object of which is to eliminate an undertaking or any of its products from a market or to prevent it from entering the market.

### 2. <u>Environmental and Social Responsibility</u>

In order to promote sustainable development, AFD seeks to ensure that internationally recognised environmental and social standards are complied with. Suppliers, contractors, subcontractors, consultants or subconsultants for AFD-financed contracts shall consequently undertake in the Statement of Integrity to:

# PART 2 – Employer's Requirements

### Section VII - Scope of Employer's Requirements

The scope of Employer's Requirements shall cover as a minimum:

### 1. Background

The project area is located in Faisalabad, which is the third largest city of Punjab with an estimated population of 3.4 million with growth rate of 3.70% and is a hub of industrial activities in the country. The city has grown rapidly to the present population of about 3.4 million people, but the environmental infrastructure development, including water supply system is lagging behind. Canal (Rakh Branch) passing through the middle of the city, divides it into two distinct zones; eastern and western. Water and Sanitation Agency, commonly known as WASA, subsidiary of Faisalabad Development Authority, (FDA) was established on April 23, 1978 under the Development of Cities Act 1976 with a view to providing and catering for the services with regard to Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage. The WASA Faisalabad is administratively aligned to "Housing Urban development and Public Health Engineering Department (HUD & PHED)" of the Government of Punjab.

Presently, total service area of the Water and Sanitation Agency (WASA) of Faisalabad is 225 sq.km that includes 113 urban union councils of four towns. WASA provides about 72% of the city with sewerage services and about 70% with water services. Groundwater underlying is brackish. Water is transported to Faisalabad city by means of underground piping networks from aquifer near Chenab River and Jhang Branch Canal on western side of the city mainly for drinking purpose through multistage pumping stations. A project "Greater Faisalabad Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage, Phase I" was implemented with the assistance of Asian Development Bank in 1992. Primary Water Supply network in the city was laid under this project.

WASA-F, through Islamic Republic of Pakistan (GOP) and the Government of Punjab (Go Punjab) has recently mobilized funds from Agence Française de Développement (AFD) to enhance water services to endusers in its areas of operations under a major Project called "Extension of water resources for Faisalabad city – Phase II".

### 2. Project Scope and Objectives

Within the scope of the project, 25 MGD Water Treatment Plant (WTP) and 5 MGD extension to the existing 10 MGD WTP shall be constructed to meet the shortage of drinking water in the eastern part of the city. The project also includes a NRW component to reduce the water losses (physical and commercial) in a selected District Metering Zone (DMZ).

The project will enable approximately 750,000 of Faisalabad's inhabitants to benefit from a safe drinking water supply service, and improve their living conditions both from the health and economic point of view. The project will also reduce water losses improving the utility, financial performance and service delivery.

The project aims to improve the living conditions of the inhabitants of Faisalabad by developing the public drinking water service. Its specific objectives are:

- (i) Expanding the service and improve the quality (continuity and pressure) of the water service,
- (ii) Preserving the water resource, and
- (iii) Reinforcing the viability of financial position of WASA-FAISALABAD.

### 3. Project Components:

The project involves the implementation of the following three (3) components:

- i) Construction of a New 25 MGD Surface Water Treatment Plant
- ii) Extension of the Existing Water Treatment Plant (10 to 15 MGD)
- iii) Non-Revenue Water Reduction Programme

First two out of three components will be implemented on Design Build and Operation with 3 year's O&M

period under FIDIC "Gold Book" conditions of contract for Design, Build and Operate. Whereas, Non-revenue water reduction programme component shall be taken over by the Employer upon its commissioning with "one year" Defect Notification Period (DNP).

### Component 1: Construction of a New 25 MGD Surface Water Treatment Plant




Figure 2: Location of the new 25 MGD WTP, Intake and Pre-Settling Tanks

This Component involves the construction of a new 25 MGD surface water treatment plant near Jaranwala Road and a Pre-settling Facility prior to WTP at a designated location shown in Figure 2. Raw water taken from intake structure at Lower Gugera Branch Canal is sent to Pre-settling Facility that aim to reduce incoming turbidity.

Water from the Pre-settling Facility shall be transmitted via Raw Water Transmission Line (RWTL-2) to the raw water storage reservoir at the plant site, where it will then enter the treatment trains. Project shall include all necessary pumping stations in the Pre-settling Facility and at the outlet of the WTP.

The new WTP's final production capacity shall be 25 MGD. The project includes the civil and M&E works necessary to achieve the full WTP capacity and the installation of the required processes for all facilities. The water treatment process primarily is envisaged to be based on conventional coagulation-flocculation-clarification followed by filtration and chlorination as disinfection. Drying beds will be used for sludge dewatering.

The water treatment plant shall fulfil the requirements stated in the "Guidelines for Drinking Water Quality - Recommendations" by the World Health Organization (WHO) and those stated in the relevant Pakistani legislation (PEQS).

The project area is characterized by a mostly flat terrain with natural changes in grade limited to a couple of meters. Therefore, it is expected that some mechanical pressurization will be necessary for the transmission of raw water to the treatment facilities.

The new 25 MGD WTP design shall not include;

- Raw water transmission line (RWTL-1) from intake structure to pre-settling facility
- The transmission line (RWTL-2) from pre-settling facility to water treatment plant
- The treated water transmission line (TWTL) from water treatment plant to distribution system

The tentative layout of the plant together with an initial process diagram are shown below:




Figure 3: Conceptual Draft Layout of 25 MGD WTP




Figure 4: Conceptual Draft Layout of 25 MGD Pre-Settling Facility




Figure 5: Conceptual Process Flow Diagram of 25 MGD WTP

### Component 2: Extension of Existing Water Treatment Plant (10 to 15 MGD)

The 5 MGD extension WTP shall expand the treatment capacity of the existing 10 MGD plant to 15 MGD by adding an additional train of basin providing conventional treatment and extra sludge drying beds. The design is envisaged to incorporate a pre-settling facility that will improve plant operation by reducing incoming turbidity.


The water treatment plant shall fulfil the requirements stated in the "Guidelines for Drinking Water Quality - Recommendations" by the World Health Organization (WHO) and those stated in the relevant Pakistani legislation (PEQS).

The proposed 5 MGD extension to the existing 10 MIGD WTP is comprised of the main treatment facilities, sludge drying beds as well as a full capacity, i.e., 15 MIGD new pre-settling system. The extension WTP's final production capacity will add 5 MGD to the existing 10 MGD WTP. The project includes the civil and M&E works required to achieve 5 MGD WTP capacity and the installation of the required processes for all facilities. The water treatment process is envisaged to be based on conventional coagulation-flocculation-clarification followed by filtration and chlorination as disinfection. Drying beds will be used for sludge dewatering.

Figure 6 shows a satellite image of the existing of 10 MGD WTP, which shall have its capacity increased by 5 MGD. As shown in the figure, the 10 MGD WTP is located near the Rakh Branch Canal in Faisalabad City. For the extension, raw water is envisaged to go through a pre-settling process prior to the treatment processes. These units shall consist of mechanical flocculators and coagulators, followed by lamellar clarifiers with sludge hoppers. Water shall be then passed through rapid sand filters and chlorination. It shall be finally stored in the existing underground reservoir. Collected sludge shall be transferred to drying beds for dewatering.




Figure 8: Conceptual Process Flow Diagram of 5 MGD Extension of 10 MGD WTP

### Note:

All the parameters including Process Flow diagram & Layout Plan of WTPs mentioned under this document are tentative and are given just for information purpose to be used as reference for the bidding process. The detailed engineering design targeting the optimization of the construction and operational works shall be under the responsibility of the Contractor. Geotechnical & Topographic survey reports that will be provided to the pre-qualified bidders at bidding stage will be given only for information purpose.

### Component 3: Non-Revenue Water (NRW) Reduction Programme

Component 3 includes a Non-Revenue Water (NRW) reduction program and the establishment of Zone (District Metering Zone/DMZ and District Metering Area) through installation of bulk meters, customer meters, SCADA system, leak detection and piloting the concept of 24/7 service. This NRW reduction program shall focus on one pilot zone selected out of the 16 DMZ established by the WASA Faisalabad.

Non-Revenue Water (NRW) reduction program and the establishment of zone shall be implemented on the selected DMZ and shall include the followings:

- Updating of hydraulic modeling for the selected DMZ
- Construction of the zone bulk meter chambers
- Installation of DMZ and DMA bulk meters in line with the result of hydraulic modeling
- Integration of installed bulk meters to SCADA system
- Establishing firewalled DMZ through installation of valves, hydraulic modelling, zero pressure testing, other related testing
- Installation of subscriber meters and their cabinets to reduce illegal connections
- For the recovery of commercial losses; Transferring the customer and infrastructure information in selected DMZ to GIS
- Preparation of meter reading routes
- Determination of targets for reducing commercial losses
- Implementation of active loss/leakage management
- Leak detection and elimination of physical & commercial losses (mains, service connections, valves, etc.)
- Installation of SCADA systems

### 4. Construction Period

The Design-Build period shall be 36 months.

Defect Notification Period (DNP) shall be 12 months for Non-revenue water reduction programme component upon its commissioning.

### 5. Operation Period

The operation period includes operation and maintenance (O&M) of the Treatment Plant facilities designed and built by the Contractor and shall start at the completion of commissioning stage for whole of the Works, and shall be 36 months. This period shall include the training for the local operational staff to ensure the smooth handing over of the facility.

### 6. General Information

### 6.1 Project Area

### 6.1.1 Geographical Location

Faisalabad District is one of the four districts of Faisalabad division. Faisalabad is bound on the north by Chiniot and Sheikhupura, on the east by Sheikhupura and Sahiwal, on the south by Sahiwal and Toba Tek Singh and on the west by Jhang. The total area of the district is 5856 square kilometers. Its Coordinates are 31.4181°N, and 73.0776°E. According to the 2017 Census of Pakistan, it had a population of 7,882,444 persons, out of which 52.25% were urban and 47.75% lived in rural areas. The city is linked to M-2 motorway (Islamabad-Lahore motorway) with M-4 motorway section (Pindi-Bhattian Faisalabad motorway). Faisalabad (formerly known as Lyallpur) is also linked with railway. The district is subdivided into 6 Tehsils namely Chak Jhumra, Jaranwala, Tandlianwala, Samundari, Faisalabad City and Faisalabad Sadar.

The natural surface elevation of the district is 184 meters above the sea level.

### 6.1.2 Geology and Topography

The district of Faisalabad is part of the alluvial plains between the Himalayan foothills and the central core of the Indian subcontinent. The alluvial deposits are typically over a thousand feet thick<sup>1</sup>. The interfluves are believed to have been formed during the Late Pleistocene and feature river terraces<sup>2</sup>. These were later identified as old and young floodplains of the Ravi River on the Kamalia and Chenab Plains. The old floodplains consist of Holocene deposits from the Ravi and Chenab rivers<sup>3</sup>.

The soil consists of young stratified silt loam or very fine sandy loam that makes the subsoil weak in structure with common kankers at only five feet. The course of the rivers within Faisalabad is winding and often subject to frequent alternations. In the rainy season, the currents are very strong. This leads to high floods in certain areas, which do last for a number of days. The Rakh and Gugera Canals have encouraged the water levels in the district however; the belt on the Ravi River has remained narrow. The riverbed does include the river channels, which have shifted the sand bars and low sandy levees leading to river erosion. Faisalabad is situated at the center of the lower Rechna Doab, the area is located between the Chenab and Ravi rivers. There is a mild slope from the northeast to the southwest with an average fall of 0.2–0.3 meters per kilometer (1.1–1.6 feet per mile). The city is situated at an elevation of about 183 meters (600 ft.). The topography is marked by valleys, local depression, and high ground<sup>4</sup>.

The project area is located in 2A Degree Seismic Zone. The Seismicity Map<sup>5</sup> of Faisalabad is shown in the below.




Figure 9: The Seismicity Map of Faisalabad

### 8.1.4 Climate

The climate of Faisalabad features a hot desert climate. The climate of the district can see extremes, with a summer maximum record temperature of 48 °C was observed on May 26, 2010, and a winter temperature of −1 °C. The mean maximum and minimum temperatures in summer are 39 °C and 27°C, respectively. In winter, it peaks at around 21°C and 6°C, respectively. The summer season starts in April and continues until October. May, June, and July are the hottest months. The winter season starts from November and continues till March. December, January, and February are the coldest months. The average yearly rainfall lies only at about 500 mm and is highly seasonal with approximately half of the yearly rainfall takes place in July and August. The nearest climate station is at Faisalabad.

Summer season starts from April and continues until mid of October, whereas winter season begins in November and end in February or middle of March. Monsoon season remains from July to September. The annual average high temperature is 48°C and the lowest is 17.4°C. The temperature average in June, the hottest month, is 41°C. January is the coldest month, with temperatures averaging 4.8°C. The driest month is November. There is 2 mm of precipitation in November. Most of the precipitation here falls in August, averaging 97 mm.

### 8.1.5 Socio-Economical Situation

The Faisalabad region is rapidly growing as an economic base of Pakistan and industrial development is taking place in the urban vicinity in the haphazard manner. Faisalabad is well connected by rail, road, and air. Faisalabad is the third populous city in Pakistan, and the second largest in the eastern province of Punjab. Historically one of the first planned cities within British India, it has long since developed into a cosmopolitan metropolis. Faisalabad has grown to become a major industrial and distribution center because of its central location in the region and connecting roads, rails, and air transportation. It has been referred to as the "Manchester of Pakistan".




Figure 10: Faisalabad vs 3 other big cities' population comparison<sup>7</sup>




Figure 11: Expected population of Faisalabad Urban Towns in 20338



The city is main center of the textile industry, accounting for more than half of Pakistan's total textile shipments. (Punjab Board of Investment and Trade 2016) Faisalabad is the second most populous district in Punjab. Primarily an agro-industrial district, Faisalabad contributes approximately \$5billion to the national GDP through its textile exports. Spread across six densely populated urban, suburban, and rural tehsils, Faisalabad has been the site of many development projects in recent years. However, the public

infrastructure is still grossly insufficient to cater to the growing demands of Pakistan's third largest metropolis.

Faisalabad district has been endowed by nature with a rich soil, aided by an efficient irrigation system. The district is flat sandy plain formed by Chenab and Ravi rivers. The Ravi River flows along southeastern boundary of district. The lower Chenab canal provides water to 80% of cultivated lands making it the main source of irrigation. The area is exceptionally favorable for canal irrigation.

Faisalabad has earned a name for agricultural productivity, out of total area of 1,443,703 acres of this district, 1,150,042 acres of land is irrigated through canals while the rest of the area is either Barani or cultivated through tube-wells.

### 8.2 Water Supply Sources

The River Chenab flows about 36 Km to the North West of Faisalabad while River Ravi is about 40 Km to the South East. The Gugera Branch Canal originates from the Lower Chenab Canal. The main areas to which it supplies water are Toba Tek Singh and Faisalabad in Punjab province of Pakistan, it as named after Gugera that was district at that time. Start point is lower Chenab Canal, few yards away from the Bachiana Village, the length is 85 miles (137 km) and the end point is Moongi Bungalow.

The Lower Chenab Canal(LCC) off-taking from Khanki Head Works located in Gujranwala district on river Chenab was constructed in 1892-98. This canal has two parts i.e. LCC Main Line Upper (RD 0+000 to RD+141+436) and LCC Main Line Lower (RD 0+000 to RD+58+857) and is supplying irrigation water to 3.031 million acres of culturable command area (CCA) through a network of




Figure 12: Lower Gugera Branch




Figure 13: Lower Gugera Branch<sup>10</sup>

The city was first provided potable water in 1903 and the Water Works were augmented over the years, including supply of filtered water in 1906. Presently the following water supply schemes are providing potable water supply to the citizens of Faisalabad.




Figure 14: Existing Water Supply of Faisalabad
